# Nature Center Programs

## Nature Center Tours

Tours are designed to meet the needs of the individuals or organization requesting the tour. Tours must be pre-arranged with our Education Department.

## School Field Trips

School field trip programs may be designed to complement Arizona state curriculum standards.

## Kindermornings

Walk, fly, and slither through nature as we discover the world around us. Come for breakfast, listen to stories, do animal activities, and meet some of our wild friends. This program is designed for family groups consisting of siblings ages 3-5 accompanied by one adult. Continental breakfast will be served and children are encouraged to come in their pajamas. Offered the third Monday of each month.

## Camp Wild

Campers will explore the lives, habitats, and conservation of animals native to the Southwest. Our single-day camps or multiple-day sessions include exciting hands on activities, craft projects, science experiments, and walks through our nature center. Camps are designed for children ages 6-11. Class size is limited to 10 children per age group for a unique and personal experience with our trained staff and volunteers.

## Girl Scout Workshops

Spend a day full of fun and animal adventure. Earn badges and learn about wildlife conservation by playing games, making crafts, and working as a team. Top off this fun-filled day with a tour of our nature center and see every thing from porcupines to endangered wolves. Workshops are designed for Daisies, Brownies, and Junior Girl Scouts.

## Home School Tuesdays

Our engaging, educational, and fun home school classes are a great way for children to learn about wildlife and conservation. Classes are held the second Tuesday of every month with a new, exciting theme for each class. Our hands on approach and small class sizes keep every experience unique and personal.

## School Outreach

Enhance your students’ wildlife and conservation studies. School presentations are based upon Arizona state curriculum standards and are offered in the classroom or in school assembly format. Subjects may include:

- \*Wildlife in your back yard (Pre-K - 12)
- \*Reptiles of Arizona (Pre-K - 12)
- \*Desert Adaptations (Pre-K - 12)
- Saving Arizona’s Wildlife (grades 4 and up)
- Arizona Birds of Prey (K-12)
- Predator or Prey? (K-12)
- Arizona’s Endangered Species (K-12)
- Return of the Mexican Gray Wolf to Arizona (7-12)
- Arizona’s lost cats: Jaguars, Jaguarundi, and Ocelot (7-12)
- \*These programs may be modified specifically for Pre-K through grade 2 students.
